Windsor Framework unveiled to fix problems of the Northern Ireland Protocol

The <u>Windsor Framework</u>, agreed by the Prime Minister and European Commission President, replaces the old Northern Ireland Protocol, providing a <u>new legal and UK constitutional framework</u>.

Exporting food and drink to China

In April 2021, China's General Administration of Customs (GACC) announced new registration requirements that affect all overseas food manufacturers, processors, and storage facilities of food products exported to China. These requirements are described in China's Decree 248 and came into effect on 1 January 2022.

In advance of bringing in the new import regulations in January 2022, GACC offered businesses who were or planned to export medium and low risk products to China to 'fast track' their application. This enabled businesses who were successful in their fast track application to continue to export to China from 1st January 2022, without registering via the new China Import Food Enterprise Registration (CIFER) system.

However, GACC now requires all businesses who were successful as part of the fast-track process in 2021, to modify their details on the Cifer system before 30 June 2023.

To modify an application, businesses are required to update and provide the necessary information required when registering with the GACC under their product category. This includes a signed and stamped checklist and declaration. Failure to modify a registration could result in delays, blockages or an inability to export to China.
