### **Border Target Operating Model published**

Yesterday (5 April 2023) the UK Government, in collaboration with the Scottish and Welsh Governments, published its plan to strengthen its borders against biosecurity threats and illegal imports.

The <u>draft Target Operating Model</u> proposes a new approach to security controls (applying to all imports), and sanitary and phytosanitary controls (applying to imports of live animals, animal products, plants and plants products) at the border.

It sets out how controls will be simplified, digitised and, over time, delivered through the UK's new Single Trade Window. The document has been developed through engagement with stakeholders, collaboration across the UK, Scottish and Welsh Governments, and engagement with officials from the devolved administration in Northern Ireland.

The draft Target Operating Model proposes implementation of controls through three major milestones:

**31 October 2023** - The introduction of health certification on imports of medium risk animal products, plants, plant products and high risk food (and feed) of non-animal origin from the EU.

31 January 2024 - The introduction of documentary and risk-based identity and physical checks on medium risk animal products, plants, plant products and high risk food (and feed) of non-animal origin from the EU. At this point Imports of Sanitary and Phytosanitary goods from the rest of the world will begin to benefit from the new risk based model.

31 October 2024 - Safety and Security declarations for EU imports will come into force from 31 October 2024. Alongside this, we will introduce a reduced dataset for imports and use of the UK Single Trade Window will remove duplication where possible across different pre-arrival datasets

The Cabinet Office will now run a programme of engagement with stakeholders from all nations of the UK and international partners which will last for a six week period. It will consist of sector specific workshops, international events as well as wider stakeholder groups and bespoke sessions, covering all aspects of the Border Target Operating Model.

The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) will host sector specific sessions and seminars for those who import or export: food, live animals, animal products, plants and/or plants products to or from the United Kingdom.

A list of all engagement activities can be found below. Please take a look through and find the event that will be most useful for you. All of the events will be virtual (unlimited capacity) aside from the one in-person event (limited capacity) run by the Cabinet Office.

If you are an existing member of border-related forums run by HMRC, Defra or FSA, they will be in touch directly with other opportunities to provide feedback on the draft Border Target Operating Model.

Safety & Security (S&S) Regime Teach In - Online (Wednesday 12th April, 11am-12pm, sign up here)
